Parish Perspective

It was the end of an era. On Sunday, January the 11^{th,} St. Ignatius of Antioch parish said "thank you," but not good-bye, to Lorraine Lohmeier for her service of over twenty-five years to our parish; most of those as Parish Secretary.

Ever since the founding of our parish, Lorraine has been an active and essential member of the parish that enabled us, and those who came before us, to arrive at the well established point we find ourselves now. My first encounter with Lorraine some 17 years ago came after a Mass when Fr. Vince Cotter (Pastor at the time) was reading announcements and asked Lorraine to stand up so she could be recognized as the go-to person for a certain event. He said "So, if you want *such and such* (I forget exactly what it was) see Lorraine. After all, she runs the parish! I'm just a figurehead, really." What I have come to learn and experience of Lorraine and of the easy going nature of Fr. Vince; those words of his had more weight behind them than what meets the ear.

Lorraine has been the one vertebrae backbone of our parish. She knows most all the parishioners, their names, children's names, when and where they were baptized or received First Eucharist, who is related to whom; and if she doesn't have the information on the tip of her tongue, she knows where to find it!

More than a few people who have dealt with the Church Office have been amazed at Lorraine's wealth of information, commitment to service, and her ability to follow through in getting any job done.

And so it was that for the first time, since her retirement, I saw Lorraine volunteering to change the church environment from Christmas to Winter's Ordinary Time. It came time to take a small coffee break and a handful of us gathered around the organ's console. We started talking and as Loraine spoke her whole countenance changed. She was more relaxed than I had ever seen her before. Her face seemed to glow with a light from within, and I wondered if God was letting us see her "angelic" side. She has certainly been an angel for us; bringing God's messages to us and performing angelic-like miracles that needed to be done on time that only Lorraine could do.

How will we do without her in the office? By the support of her prayers, her teaching hand, and her angelic example.
