

Justice Corner

Gratitude is a cardinal response to the gift of life and family. At this time of year, it is easy to let the chill of the weather and world events influence what should be the basic response to our Godgiven gift of life. We live in troublesome times and it is easy to let the discouragement cloud our time of Thanksgiving. Family squabbles, economic difficulties, decisions made in haste and thoughtlessness, tend to eat away at the basic instinct of turning to God in gratitude for what we have been given. We find ourselves complaining more than praising. The TV and our apps encourage us to grasp after material goods without seeing the poverty that eats away at the good nature of so many of our citizens. We turn to our faith to guide us. Our faith has given us the Eucharist which means Thanksgiving. Our faith gives us hope in God, the Author of life, so we can hold on in difficult circumstances.

Our church fills its tables with Thanksgiving baskets, and Gubbio socks, and backpacks for needy school children. Fathers work to provide the food for the table. Mothers try to make a great meal with all the traditional foods: turkey and dressing, green bean casserole, cranberry relish, sweet potato, pecan and pumpkin pies. Children help decorate and set the table. At the time of grace, we each mention what we are thankful for in this year of 2016. Positive actions overcome our faults and fears because we have a Savior who came to redeem us and His Word is everlasting. As Alpha and Omega, He calls us into being more than we can imagine. He stands at the end of time as well as at the beginning putting all things together in love. At the end of the year we have Christ the King of the Universe and at the beginning of Advent we are reminded to "Stay awake because you know not the day or the hour."

We must resist the "thief" who tries to steal our happiness and "throw off the works of darkness." A suggestion that will help us overcome discouragement is to make a list of our blessings. Another is to imagine our own end-time and see what we need to do to accomplish the mission we have been given. If you are a mother or father, find one way to be a better one and do one action this week that takes a step toward that goal. If you are a child, find one way to be more helpful and contribute to the family joyfully. If you are single, reach out to those you know in ways that will let them know you care for them. If you are elderly or infirm, expand your prayer to the places of conflict in the world.

I have a picture on my wall of a figure holding the world in a deep embrace. I see this picture when I am consumed by my own disappointments. It encourages me to move out of my own darkness and to send love into the world instead of being so selfishly focused on my own needs and wants. There is a spiritual practice called tonglen. It asks that we breathe in the sufferings of this world and breathe out love to all who need it. In prayer this week try this practice first with your immediate circle, then with our area, then with the world and all its needs. If you have a particular area of concern such as human trafficking, domestic violence, refugees, hate crimes, etc, spend time in prayer sending your out-breath of love to those suffering from these injustices. When I am faced with my own discouragements, it is difficult to try to take in more suffering, but that is exactly what Jesus did. He came in love to give love. In Eucharist He continues to do that over and over. May we imitate His example in our prayer and actions this week.
