#### Justice Corner

Today's article continues our series of the *Ten Essentials of Parish Life*. The second essential or value that parishes must demonstrate is **Liturgy:** 

"For the liturgy is the outstanding means whereby the faithful may express in their lives, and manifest to others, the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true church." (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #2)

Thanks to good leadership, prepared liturgical ministers, and well prepared music and choirs, our parish demonstrates that liturgy is the "source and summit" of Christian life. We value our services and show up for them. Our parishioners do not just show up on Christmas and Easter, but value our Sunday experience. Through reflective silence, well chosen hymns and well prepared environment, we remember the death and resurrection of the Lord and renew our efforts of being His hands and feet in the world. "Go, you are sent forth!" at the end of the Mass is a reminder to all to practice being Christ in the world.

Often, we are challenged to make liturgy the "work of the people." Vatican II has taught us how to be a people in full, conscious and active participation. It doesn't matter that you do not have a great singing voice. It doesn't matter that you lose your place. What matters is that you participate together as a community of faith, singing, praying, listening and gesturing to and with one another.

This is how we welcome the stranger. This is how we celebrate the Paschal Mystery in the midst of diversity. This is how we support one another in the midst of life's trials and struggles. This is how we remember the death and resurrection of Christ in 2018. So here are some ideas to broaden our celebrations and make the great liturgies we have be more a part of our life:

- 1. Be here before mass starts to participate in the musical reflection before the procession.
- 2. If you are a liturgical minister, improve your preparation by spending more time preparing to read, give communion, etc. Attend a workshop provided by the parish or the diocese at least once a year.
- 3. Give the preachers constructive feedback on their efforts.
- 4. Join the environment committee to help create the beautiful worship spaces for each season.
- 5. Prepare for Sunday Mass by using the various worship aids, missals, etc. available from Liturgical Press, and other sources. Meditate on the readings beforehand seeing what the spirit has to say to you. Think about the message of the preaching afterwards.
- 6. Join the greeters who make everyone feel welcome as they come to church.
- 7. Teach your children how to go within in silence and to be prayerful. Bed time and meal time are places to practice a moment of reflection before words are said.

So we all must take on the rolls of greeter and proclaimer of Christ's Presence in the world. Through our communion with one another, we witness to a world that is redeemed in Christ's love.

## Parish Perspective

Here is Peter's "Best of" article for this bulletin:

God is My Co-Builder

One of the things I do in my spare spare-time (yeh, it's like 3<sup>rd</sup> in my list of priorities) is to work on building my airplane. I've been working on it for 21 years now, and the fact that it's a replica P-40 WWII fighter means I've been building it for four times as many years as the entire war lasted. It's been a learning experience about aircraft and myself.

Reflecting on my current efforts to develop and install a fuel system I've found that the tangle of pathways, pumps, filters, gascolator, quick drains, hose-end fittings and the array of special fittings to tie everything together is very similar to growing in faith as a follower of Christ. When we start our lives as Christians, we don't know what our path through life will be like. We don't know all the tools we'll need or all the little bits and pieces of "stuff" (books, study guides, courses) that we will need to get us through this lifelong project that is our lives. We learn about Christ and, hopefully about ourselves, as we go along. Each turn in life gives us the opportunity to learn about Him who is our Lord.

Like any building project there are set-backs. There are times when hard labor and effort must be thrown on the scrapheap of human mistakes and we start all over again; sometimes it costs us dearly. In the tragic lows, we have to have faith that God is with us, that he will bring about in us the success of His plan for us. We can't see God's plan for us as on sheets of paper or blueprints; even the best of plans leave something out. When we run out of prescribed plan, it's up to us to decide how to proceed or what to use to accomplish the task. When this happens, we consult others who have done the same thing, we use our best judgment based on our own experience, and yes, we pray for guidance.

In building an airplane there are times when great strides in progress can be seen and even regular visitors utter the word "wow" as they see the great change that has taken place. Other times the same amount of progress has been made but it's hidden deep within the structure and no one can see it. Christ can change people and make great progress with them in becoming the image of his Son on earth. At other times people can't see that a person has changed at all, but they do, deep in their hearts where only God can see. Every builder knows that the secret to success is to keep your heart and mind down the road, for the eventual pay-off; and to keep your eyes on the one-step-at-a-time, one-day-at-a-time chore at hand. Being a follower of Christ is the same. We keep focused on our heavenly reward as we take care of the needs of our brothers and sisters, one day at a time.

Some parishioners have seen me wear a T-shirt with a gaping shark's mouth painted on a P-40. The inscription states "God is my co-builder." That refers to the aircraft and especially, to us all.
