#### Justice Corner

Have you even judged anyone harshly? The Gospel says, "The measure with which you measure will in return be measured unto you." That is a scary saying. We used our power of judgment daily to make decisions. We decide to be friends with this person and to let another go their way. We decide we like this one but not that one. We decide to cooperate with one and not with another. How many of us have had harsh words within our family or our circle of friends? Our judgments have not always been with the quality of mercy with which we ourselves would like to be judged. Yet Jesus reminds us that if we do not practice mercy, we will not be judged with mercy.

God expects us to use our commonsense in human matters. He gave us a marvelous brain where we can weigh things and make right decisions. If someone is doing wrong, He expects us to use our heads and not cooperate with evil. The problem is that there are very few decisions in life that are simple. There are always many factors, motives, angles to think about before we make a judgment. Things are not always clear. People have mixed motivations. So it is difficult to decide.

When it comes to views about social justice it is even more complicated because a person's or group's reasons for an action are often hidden from us. We are not privy to the inner workings of government and power. It is easy to measure the wrong when someone shoots up a crowd or runs over a child and does not stop, but not so easy when it comes to policy and the motivations behind it. It is easy to see hunger and bring a loaf of bread to the table, but not so easy to change the systems that leave a person or family in hunger.

Yet God asks us to bring the lens of mercy to our measuring stick. There is a poem (whose author I forgot) which says, "Everyone has a hard life." An action which we judge as wrong is complicated by the circumstances in the life of the wrong doer, as well as our own experiences from which we make a judgment. The spiritual writer, Martin Laird, gives us a clue when he states, "We are the mountain, not the weather that appears around it."\* We must stand strong with God, our mountain, to weather the storms of the current world around us. We must ask God to guide our decisions and get out of the way when He tells us what action to take. In Ireland I learned a prayer which says that:

Lord, today let me go where you want me to go Say what You want me to say Do what You want me to do And let me get out of the way!

We can pray this prayer as we look for the answers to the turmoil currently besieging our country. We can bring the lens of mercy to our conversations. We can pray with our anger and not act out of it. We can dismiss the storms of the nightly news because we know that God's mercy is present in the world. His strength is like the mountain which sits in the middle of our world (Mt. Diablo). The Psalm says, "I lift up my eyes to the mountain from whence comes my help. My help is in the Lord who made heaven and earth." Ps. 121

First Deanery Meeting of 2019

On February 12<sup>th</sup> a deanery meeting was held for the Delta Deanery at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish in Brentwood. Our entire Church Staff attended. It was the first time, to my recollection, that the meeting was started with the singing of a song, *All Are Welcome*, immediately after the opening prayer. Musical accompaniment was provided by our own Don Pearson playing upon a piano dragged from a corner of the parish hall. Without written music Don included musical flourishes to the familiar piece to the delight of all.


Two pastors gave introductory statements about their parishes and the influences that are changing the nature of their parish communities. They were Fr. Ron Schmitt from St. Ann's in Byron and Fr. Robert from St. Ignatius of Antioch. Fr. Ron announced that his parish has gone solar and is looking forward to the environmental and financial benefits from the conversion. He also mentioned an influx in the number of people attending Mass from east India. Fr. Robert gave an extensive overview of our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations, plans, and thanksgiving to all the people who throughout the years have made us the parish we are today. He also gave attention to Fr, Ramiro at Most Holy Rosary who in essence is starting a new parish of his own. With the departure of the Dominicans, the assignment of new clergy, and the challenges of enculturating new parishioners with those who find change difficult to accept, Fr. Robert extended the support of our parish to him for the sake of the deanery, both parishes, the diocese, and the strengthening of the kingdom of God on earth.

Following the introductions, we were separated into three main groups. The priests and deacons were off to the library to discuss clerical subjects. Another group of "administration / office" personnel were off in one direction while Faith Formation people were herded off in another. As I was rising from my chair Don asked, "Where do I go, I don't have anything in common with the other groups?" I replied, "Stay right here. Form your own group with the other music ministers who are here." Sure enough, Don as tenacious as a bulldog, formed his own group right there. Frances Rojek and I were off to the Faith Formation group and we both contributed to the members who had serious questions about the youth in their parishes and the fate of their souls.

The meeting was concluded with another song, again with Don at the keyboard, *Christ Be Our Light*. What a good way to end a meeting that shines light down the road for the future of our deanery.


